As you prepare for worship... Harvest B

Joel 2:21-27: There had been a time of devastation in the land (locusts, hoppers, etc.) as a result of God punishing the people, we are told. But this time has ended. God has forgiven them and showers pity on His people. God returned fertility to the land, restored Judah to a place of honour among the nations, and destroyed the locusts. Our reading concludes with God renewing His covenant – He is Israel's God and they shall never be put to shame again.

1 Timothy 2:1-7: This letter was written at a dark time for the emerging Christian Church. They had come under scrutiny for not joining in the worship of Roman gods. Paul urged the believers to pray for those in authority in the hope that they may be able to lead quiet and peaceable lives. All this, he wrote, is in accord with God's plan so that, through the prayers and witness of the Church, even the rulers of the age might come to faith, for God desires everyone to be saved.

Matthew 6:25-33: This passage is a continuation of the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus addressed our penchant for worrying; worrying about what we will eat, what we will wear, etc. Look at the birds of the air! Though they work hard to get their food, they don't worry whether or not they will eat. If God cares for birds and plants, He will also care for us too. Trust God!
