As you prepare for worship... Proper 29B

Isaiah 53:10-11: This is a familiar passage from the Good Friday Liturgy. The prophet proclaimed that it is God's will that His Servant suffer as an offering for sin. Victory will not come in his lifetime but future generations will remember his sacrifice. Because he is righteous in his self-offering, he will make "many" righteous and bear their iniquities. Many people see this "suffering servant" as Jesus.

Hebrews 5:1-10: The unknown author has proclaimed Christ as our High Priest, who, rather than offering someone or something else as a sacrifice for sin, allowed himself, according to the will of the Lord, to be sacrificed. Just as Aaron was appointed by God (the first High Priest) so God, at his baptism, appointed Jesus as High Priest. Unlike other High Priests, however, Christ is a priest for ever like Melchizedek, who was a Canaanite priest who brought bread and wine to Abram, just like Jesus gave bread and wine for us to remember him.

Mark 10:35-45: The disciples had a hard time understanding Jesus' view of power – they argued as to who was the greatest, they complained because someone was casting our demons in Jesus' name (which they could not do), then two disciples came right out and asked a favour of Jesus: to sit one at his right hand and one at his left in his kingdom. Jesus repeated himself that among the Gentiles power is used over and against people. "But it is not so among you," he said. We are to serve one another as he himself served us.
